December 25th, 2010, Taichung County was restructured and consolidated into Taichung City. As the result, the committee chairperson and some members were transferred to other positions. However, the safety promotion projects are still in progress. We visit the new district chief to explain our safe community program and report our present result as well as the importance of its long-term and continuous implementation. We finally obtain the chief’s recognition and financial support.

6: Over the past 12 months, please specify what high risk groups/environments has your ISC focused on and details of outcomes achieved?

Program A : Safety of Senior Citizens-Fall Prevention

Background : Falling is the main cause of injury at home to senior citizens above 55 years old in this area.

Improve Method/Achieved Outcome : Train volunteers to lead senior citizens for physical and balance training regularly, and to visit 300 senior citizens for home environment check for evaluation of improvement. Achieved outcomes are as followed:

- Install rate of anti-slip facility in bathtub or shower room increased from 38% to 51%.
- Install rate of handrail beside toilet increased from 18% to 58%.
- Install rate of outlet cover increased from 10% to 54%.
- Set up fire alarms in 50 households with priority of senior citizens who live alone.

Program B : More colorful world makes more colorful life of senior citizens.

Background : Senior citizens who live alone in Heping Community accounts for 89%; among them, 82% are illiterate. Most of them used to write phone numbers on calendar and as time passed, the written becomes unclear and their vision become worse, causing them unable to contact with the outside when emergency happens.

Improve Method/Achieved Outcome :

- Post number stickers and cards classified by colors (Red/119, Yellow/neighbors or friends, Green/relatives) for senior citizens to easily recognize.
- Post number cards beside the telephone or on the wall or attach to key chain to take out. Now 386 people among 366 households are using this method and is very popular among senior citizens. They comment that this convenient design really helps them memorize phone numbers.

Program C : Traffic Safety Promotion

Background : Analyzed through traffic injury records of Heping Police station during 2010, speeding, not wearing helmet and drunk driving were the top

three cases. In addition, through questionnaire on “Public Recognition of Traffic Safety and Risk Factors”, 78% people think that drinking behavior is the main cause of injuries, while 68% accounts for bad road designs, 66% for not wearing helmet and 63% for improper road signs. According to these backgrounds, we started to organize road/facility improvement, put down drunk driving and motorcycling without helmets. Besides, we promote advising senior citizens to wear bright color clothes when doing exercise in the morning or at night.

Improve Method/Achieved Outcome :

- Cooperate with community development association and neighborhood association to organize “Drinking Discipline Patrol” to prevent drunk driving in the community.
- Organize safety promotion project for young and senior citizens and to promote senior citizens and students to use light reflection bracelets and enhance education promotion.
- Cooperate with community safety and health promotion association to donate 20 helmets to district office and strictly execute ban not wearing helmets when riding motorcycle.
- According to analysis, helmet wearing rate increased from 66% to 74%.
- Aborigines promise to follow the living regulation of “No driving after drinking and no motorcycling without helmet.”

7: Over the past 12 months, have you analyzed any injury/crime data? Yes

- All injuries happened in the jurisdiction area including violence and bullying were collected by the injury surveillance unit.
- Sources : Heping District Health Center, Heping Police Department, Heping Fire Department, Kukuan Holiday Emergency Center, Ancan Clinic, schools and Dingshr Farmers’ Hospital.
- File and analyze injury data every three months and provide report to safety promotion center for reference. The analysis includes the dimension of injury, significance of problem, the effectiveness of interference and priority of implementation, in order to gradually decrease all kinds of injury year by year.

10: Over the past 12 months, what have been some of the biggest challenges to your ISC and what steps have you taken to address these?

- Most members were not familiar about self-evaluation; as a result, we employ professional teachers in this area and encourage members to join domestic SC network.
- The executive members come and go too often; therefore we unite public resources to recruit more community members for better stability.

11: Over the past 12 months, what have been some of the biggest opportunities for your ISC and what steps have you taken to sustain them?

The participation of many public resources including District Office, Taichung City Center for Prevention of Domestic Violence and Sex Assault, Bureau of Employment, Hondao Citizen's Welfare Foundation and Taipower Dajia River Power Plant helps a lot in finance and manpower, along with enthusiastic participation of residents, it is the biggest motive of our safe community. The use of community resources no matter in finance or manpower especially helps a lot in achieving the safe community program, and further brings the greatest benefit of reducing injury.

12: Finally, are there any other comments you would like to make about either your ISC or the wider ISC network (e.g. Include any comments about how you see the ISC Network better serving the members of the network).

Mountain villages still have a gap with urban communities in financial, material and human resources. As a result, in order to do community safety promotion in these areas, we have to better utilize public resources. Heping community will continuously follow the "Indicators of International Safe Community" to implement community injury surveillance mechanism, to effectively promote all kinds of safety projects and continuously participate in exchange learning with whether internal or domestic safe community network.
