5. Implementation of safety promotion program of 2010 as follows:

1) Traffic safety

Project	Details
Goal	Promotion of construction safety of Alishan highway reconstruction after Disaster on August 8 2009.
Method	Volunteer record reconstruction progress by taking pictures and notes.
Result (until the end of 2010)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Reconstruction of Chashan Bridge is complete and open to traffic. 2. Shanmei Bridge is still under construction, a temporary bridge is being used. 3. A number of road in the tribes were still under reconstruction. Committee reported construction record in the mid-year meeting. The main issue was lack of safety signs in the construction area. 4. This safety promotion organization sent out documents regarding safety issues to relative units to acquire improvements on road construction safety signs to insure general public's safety.

2) Water safety – Installation of Emergency Rescue box

Project	Details
Goal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Installed emergency rescue box at popular swimming location in Alishan Township aboriginal tribes. ● Hold training sessions for rescue equipment and rescue personnel.
Method	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Seek sponsor for emergency rescue box. 2. Discuss required items of emergency rescue box with Chiayi County fire department.

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Ask representative from each village to recommend location for emergency rescue box, and finalized the location by Chiayi county fire department. 4. Have the residents of Alishan Township install emergency rescue box at the designated location, and attend required training sessions.
Result (until the end of 2010)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Fubon Cultural and Educational Foundation and Rotary Club of Taipei agreed to sponsor 20 emergency rescue boxes at designated location. 2. Installation of emergency rescue box was complete in all villages by September. There were five locations that require further preparation before install. 3. A total of 80 people including village officers, community development representative, and Lichia elementary school teachers and students participated in training session held on October 13th.

3) Psychological rehabilitation for intentional injury prevention with children, teenager, and elderly.

Background	Disaster in August 2009 completely destroyed the living environment of residents in Alishan community, and it seriously affects everyone's life, psychological state, schooling, and career.
Strategy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Provide assistance and counseling for children and teenager's schooling and everyday life. ● Provide assistance and counseling for elderly's daily life.
Method	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Introduction of professionals and funding for psychological rehabilitation. 2. Provide assistance for children's daily life and schooling. 3. Provide assistance and psychological counseling for elderly.
Result (until the end of 2010)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A total of 120 people including elementary students from Taipei to joined the summer and winter camp. 2. Started a club for elderly at Shanmei Village. The club meets biweekly and leads by community residents, nurse, social workers, and psychologist. A total 288 people attend 24 meetings. 3. A total of 60 people attend three elderly parties at Shinmei Village.

- The disaster in August 8 2009 hit Alishan community very hard. It severely affects local residents' (especially elderly) daily life, schooling, career, and psychological state. The safety promotion team not only helps to

raise funds for reconstruction, but also introduce medical and social workers to people who needs it.

- Since children in Alishan Township need to attend junior high school in another town, our team combined with Chiayi Christian Hospital to form a group counseling program. Starting in November 2009 to June 2010, a total of 12 counseling classes were held. It helps children to adjust their emotion and attitude after the disaster and attending school in another town.
- Held suicide prevention training, volunteer training, public health promotion classes at Alishan three villages.

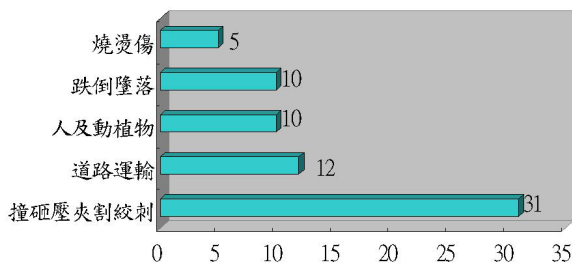

Final comments:

10: Over the past 12 months, what have been some of the biggest challenges to your ISC and what steps have you taken to address these?

10. Alishan safe community set 2010 as a reconstruction year after the disaster. A lot of reconstruction works were done in this year, including rebuilt school, roads and bridges, and home. Safe community helped on conducting reconstruction, as well as psychological rehabilitation on all residents to reduce any possibility of intentional injury.

11: Over the past 12 months, what have been some of the biggest opportunities for your ISC and what steps have you taken to sustain them?

11. The promotion of reconstructing emergency rescue box is a very great opportunity for our community. Alishan safe community received the support from enterprise in order to install 20 emergency rescue boxes in the community, which is twice as much than what we planned. Hopefully by installing more emergency rescue box, villagers and visitors will pay more attention on safety issues in water.

12. Alishan Township located in altitude from 360 meters to 3997 meters. The land area is 427.71 square kilometers, with a population of 6175 people. Since it is a high altitude and very spread out community, most villagers are aboriginals

working in mountain agriculture or tourism as a career. To enhance the medical accessibility to residents and tourists, Alishan safe community plan to promote self help skills with regular medical tour system and a better transfer system. Based on this year's top issue, we proposed the following as our future goal:

- 1). In order to improve service for elderly, the choice of team member is very important. Team member must be able to build a trusty relationship with elderly and speak the tribe language; therefore local residents will be our best pick.
- 2). Professional medical personnel travel more than 100 kilometers from hospital to the mountain service location, which is very time consuming and exhausting for them. Since the implementation of this project, training local volunteers with basic emergency medical knowledge played a big role on helping during disaster time in 2009. It not only provided real time information in the disaster affected area, but also performed simple treatment on people who need it. In the future, emergency medical network need to train more volunteers and set up more medical station.
