Surveillance of injuries:

◆ **Injury surveillance network**

1. Injury surveillance sites are established in Ruijin Community Health Service Centre and the health service stations of Mingdeli, Xiangshan, Shanjian ;
2. The policy of injury surveillance and report is established in the 16 neighbourhood committees, middle schools and primary schools as well as construction sites across the community.
3. CDC of Luwan District takes responsibility of reporting injury data from hospital.

◆ **Contents of Injury Record**

- ① Patient's basis information : name, gender, age, education background and profession.
- ② Injury condition: the time of injury, time of medication, injury black spot, injury cause and etc.
- ③ Clinic information : severity degree, prognosis, clinical diagnosis, injury type, injury part and etc.
- ④ Preparer's information

◆ **Monitoring Procedures**

- ① Injury surveillance sites are responsible for collecting injury data and completing injury record cards;
- ② Community health service stations report injury data to the Community Health Service

- Centre every month;
- ③ The Community Health Service Centre collect and report injury data to CDC of Luwan District;
 - ④ CDC carries out statistic analysis on injury data in a professional database system including injury incidence, type and category, distribution of gender and age, time and scene of injury and etc.
 - ⑤ CDC gives the analysis result back to the Safe Community Promotion Office. The six working groups make adjustments and rectifications of injury intervention measures based on the analysis results.
 - ⑥ Safe Community Promotion Office reports the analysis results to the cross-sectional group and the six promotion groups.
